



OC OPERATIONS & MAINTENANCE enhances and protects communities through the operation and maintenance of public infrastructure, while serving a critical role in responding to the needs of the public in the aftermath of devastating earthquakes, fires, storm events and other general emergencies. OC Public Works supports the O&M activities for unincorporated Orange County, the contracted cities of Mission Viejo, Lake Forest and Dana Point, the Transportation Corridor Agencies, and the Orange County Flood Control District's regional flood control facilities throughout the county.

CORE SERVICES:

- **City Contract Services** – Manages services for contract cities, graffiti abatement and traffic markings.
- **General Maintenance Services** – Oversees general maintenance services such as trash and debris removal, pump station operation and maintenance, sign fabrication and installation, and welding.
- **Maintenance Program** – Provides services including inspection of road and flood control facilities, scheduling, and contracted services.
- **Equipment Operations** – Provides various services, including light construction and heavy equipment services.

SERVICE AREA HIGHLIGHT:

OC Operations & Maintenance installed k-rails and sandbags and staged equipment along Trabuco Creek after the 2018 Holy Fire. These measures were taken to minimize impacts and shorten response times for potential mud and debris flows from the burn scar areas.

Did you know that OC Operations & Maintenance installed live feed cameras throughout the County to assist with monitoring County roads and flood channels during rain events?



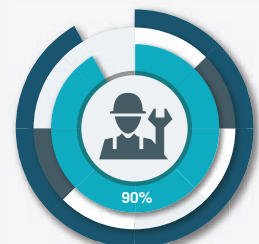
SERVICE AREA GOAL

By December 2019, construct 70% of flood control maintenance improvement projects for the entire Fiscal Year 2018-19.



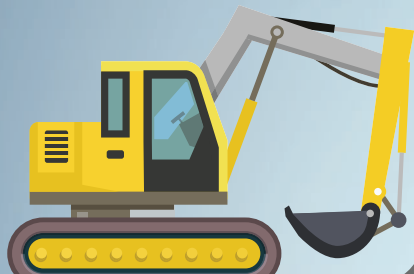
KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR

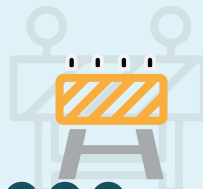

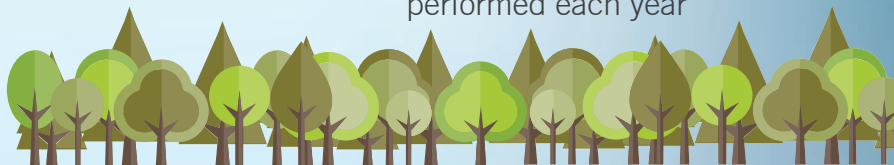

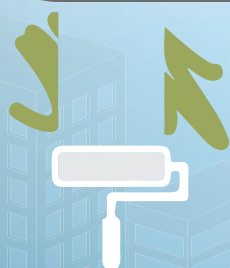
